<i>Minister for the Environment Statement 28 – Satellite Gold Roaster near Kalgoorlie (Published 23 May 1988)</i>	No conditions related to mine closure or rehabilitation.
<i>Minister for the Environment Statement 77 – Phase II of Gidji Gold Roaster, near Kalgoorlie (Published 11 September 1989)</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At least six months prior to decommissioning of the Gidji site, the proponent shall prepare a decommissioning and rehabilitation plan to the satisfaction of the Environmental Protection Authority on the advice of the Minister for Mines, for the site and its environs. The implementation of this plan shall be the responsibility of the proponent and the work shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Environmental Protection Authority on the advice of the Minister for Mines.
Minister for the Environment Statement 188 – Fimiston Project Stage II, Mine and Waste Dumps (Published 24 October 1991)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The proponent shall, within 12 months of the date of this statement, prepare and subsequently implement brief annual rehabilitation plans for the Fimiston operations to the satisfaction of the Department of Mines on advice from the Golden Mile Mining Development Planning Committee. • The proponent shall be responsible for decommissioning and removal of the plan and installations and rehabilitating the site and its environs, to the satisfaction of the Environmental Protection Authority. At least six months prior to decommissioning, the proponent shall prepare and subsequently implement a decommissioning and rehabilitation plan, to the satisfaction of the Department of Mines on advice from the Golden Mile Mining Development Planning Committee.
<i>Minister for the Environment Statement 505 – Mt Charlotte Gold Mine Reward and Northern Orebody Open Pits and Floor Pillars, Kalgoorlie (Published 31 May 1999)</i>	Project was not substantially commenced within two years of the date of the statement and hence the approval has lapsed under condition 9-2.
<i>Minister for the Environment Statement 782 – Fimiston Gold Mine Operations Extension (Stage 3) and Mine Closure Planning (Published 29 January 2009)</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prior to 30 April 2010, the proponent shall prepare a Rehabilitation and Closure Management Plan to the requirements of the Minister for Environment and the Minister for Mines and Petroleum on advice of the Environmental Protection Authority and shall submit the Plan to the Department of Environment and Conservation. This Plan shall include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The final land forms and voids; ○ The proposed land use for the mine site post-mining operations determined after consultation with relevant stakeholders; ○ Removal or, if appropriate, retention of plant and infrastructure in consultation with relevant stakeholders; ○ Long-term management of ground and surface water systems affected by mining operations; ○ Long-term management of potential acid-generating material; ○ Long-term management of pits, including the Superpit and public safety provisions; ○ Long-term management of tailings storage facilities; ○ A detailed Rehabilitation and Revegetation program which

	<p>includes local vegetation, performance criteria and a timetable to be met;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Identification of contaminated areas, including provision of evidence of notification and proposed management measures to relevant statutory authorities; ○ Post-closure maintenance and monitoring; ○ Re-instatement/retention of historically significant structures; ○ A contingency plan for a care and maintenance phase; and ○ Long-term management of vegetation significant to adjacent ethnographic sites. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● In the preparation of the Rehabilitation and Closure Management Plan required by condition 11-1, the proponent shall meet the requirements of the following agencies: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Department of Mines and Petroleum regarding items 1-3, 5-10 and 12 of condition 11-1; ○ Department of Environment and Conservation regarding items 4, 8, 9 and 10 of condition 11-1; ○ Department of Planning and Infrastructure, Western Australian Planning Commission and City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder regarding items 1, 2, 3 and 9 of condition 11-1; ○ Department of Water regarding item 4 of condition 11-1; and ○ Registrar of Aboriginal Sites regarding item 13 of conditions 11-1. ● The proponent shall review the Rehabilitation and Closure Management Plan required by condition 11-1 every two years, and shall amend the Plan as required in consultation with the agencies referred to in condition 11-2, to the requirements of the Minister for Environment on advice of the relevant agencies indicated in condition 11-2. ● The proponent shall implement the amended Rehabilitation and Closure Management Plan required by condition 11-3 until such time as the Minister for Environment determines that the proponent's closure responsibilities have been fulfilled. Note: The Department of Mines and Petroleum shall be the lead agency for co-ordinating the Rehabilitation and Closure process, with certain items of the Plan being administered by the appropriate agency as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Department of Mines and Petroleum for items 1-3, 5-10 and 12 of condition 11-1; ○ Department of Environment and Conservation for items 4, 8, 9 and 10 of condition 11-1; ○ Department of Water regarding item 4 of condition 11-1; and ○ Registrar of Aboriginal Sites regarding item 13 of condition 11-1. ● The proponent shall make the Rehabilitation and Closure Management Plan required by condition 11-1 and subsequent revisions required by condition 11-3 publicly available in a manner approved by the CEO.

Rehabilitation of the project site after decommissioning would include revegetation of roads and tracks, hardstand areas and other compacted and cleared ground.
Notice of Intent – Fimiston Project, Phase II Proposed Satellite Roaster Expansion, April 1989	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The tailings disposal area, roads and tracks, hardstand areas, and other compacted and cleared ground will be rehabilitated.
Consultative Environmental Review - Mine and Waste Dumps Fimiston, August 1990	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KCGM will implement a progressive rehabilitation programme as outlined in section 4.3 as agreed with the EPA in consultation with the Department of Mines. • Rehabilitation Objectives <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Within the limit of practical landform constraints evaluate possible end land use options. ○ Minimise off-site environmental impacts. ○ Establish a soil profile which is appropriate for the proposed end land use. ○ Establish a stable landform which as far as practicable is sympathetic to the regional landscape. ○ Consider incorporating micro-topographical modifications within the waste dumps design to aid in increasing the diversity and complexity of the vegetation and improving the potential for providing a greater range of habitats. ○ Design and establish a favourable on-site and off-site hydrology. ○ Ensure that an appropriate access system is maintained following the mining period.

Fimiston Gold Mine Operations Extension (Stage 3) and Mine Closure Planning, September 2006	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vegetation will be re-established by rehabilitating available areas as soon as practicable after disturbance. • Vegetation and the creation of fauna niches will be established during post rehabilitation activities, as soon as practicable after disturbance. • Progressive rehabilitation will ensure adverse visual amenity is reduced. • KCGM will prepare and implement a Rehabilitation Management Plan for Fimiston Operations (revised annually).
